The Readings

READING 1 Areading from the book of Deuteronomy

26:1-11

Lector When you have come into the land that the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the LORD your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the LORD your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the LORD your God that I have come into the land that the LORD swore to our ancestors to give us." When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the LORD your God, you shall make this response before the LORD your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, we cried to the LORD, the God of our ancestors; the LORD heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. The LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O LORD, have given me." You shall set it down before the LORD your God and bow down before the LORD your God. Then you, together with the Levites and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the LORD your God has given to you and to your house.





Liturgy Notes – The Great Litany

The Great Litany is the oldest English fragment of the Book of Common Prayer, authorized by Henry VIII in 1544, five years before the first prayer book was printed. At the time, Henry's intention was not liturgical reform: England was simultaneously at war with Scotland and France, so Henry required the litany to be sung in procession in parish churches throughout the country in the hope of winning God's favor. Of course, the idea of national repentance to avert disaster has biblical precedents: the king of Nineveh ordered his entire kingdom to repent in response to the message of Jonah, requiring all humans and animals to fast and wear sackcloth. Nineveh excaped defeat; England didn't.

The form of the Litany is much older than Henry: every Orthodox liturgy begins with a *Great Litany*, and a form of litany has been used in Rome from at least the fifth century. It is always a type of intercessory prayer, comprising petitions said or sung usually by a deacon, with the congregation responding. Although it may be said standing or kneeling, it has been recited in procession from ancient times. When used at the beginning of the Eucharist, it replaces everything before the Opening Collect, and also takes the place of the confession, or penitential rite.

The Great Litany was once used extensively in Anglican liturgy, not only in Lent but on New Year's Day, Rogation Days and other occasions throughout the year. However, it was increasingly ignored after the introduction of the 1979 Prayer Book: some found it too long, others resented the suggestion that they might be less than perfect. Many Episcopalians have never encountered it. However, given the state of the world and our nation, perhaps the reality of sin may not have been expunged from the human story.
