The Readings

READING I *A reading from the book of Acts*

9: 1-6, 7-20

Lector Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" He asked, "Who are you, Lord?" The reply came, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do." The men who were traveling with him stood speechless because they heard the voice but saw no one. Saul got up from the ground, and though his eyes were open, he could see nothing; so they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. For three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

Now there was a disciple in Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a vision, "Ananias." He answered, "Here I am, Lord." The Lord said to him, "Get up and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul. At this moment he is praying, and he has seen in a vision a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him so that he might regain his sight." But Ananias answered, "Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much evil he has done to your saints in Jerusalem; and here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who invoke your name." But the Lord said to him, "Go, for he is an instrument whom I have chosen to bring my name before Gentiles and kings and before the people of Israel; I myself will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name." So Ananias went and entered the house. He laid his hands on Saul and said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on your way here, has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit." And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and his sight was restored. Then he got up and was baptized, and after taking some food, he regained his strength.

For several days he was with the disciples in Damascus, and immediately he began to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, saying, "He is the Son of God."

Gospeller The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Gospeller Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, you have no fish, have you?" They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the sea. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.

When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

Liturgy Notes – The Oil of Chrism

Although practices differ concerning the use of oils in the liturgy, one constant seems to be the use of Chrism in the Baptismal rite. Ideally consecrated by the diocesan bishop during or close to Holy Week, the Oil of Chrism is distributed throughout the diocese for use in consecrating people, and setting things apart for sacred use. Viewers of “The Crown” may recall the scene in which King George VI explains to the young Elizabeth the significance of his anointing with Chrism at his coronation: ““When the holy oil touches, I am transformed, brought into direct contact with the divine. Forever changed. Bound to God. It is the most important part of the entire ceremony.”

Chrism is essentially olive oil to which other sweetly scented oils have been added – the recipe varies but usually contains balsam as well. The name is derived from the Greek word for anointing. It is almost universally used in Christian Baptism, as celebrated in both Eastern and Western Churches: Orthodox, Catholic, Protestant and Anglican. It can also be used in Confirmations, Ordinations, the consecration of a church or altar or sacred vessels and, of course, the coronation rite.

As with all sacramental substances, there are layers of meaning to the use of this oil. In the ancient world, oil was used as a healing agent, for massage and for cleansing. It has also long been used in dedicating a person to a particular ministry or mission, clearly the sense in which is used at Baptism.

Chrism, then, is a physical and visible expression of the action of the Holy Spirit, healing, restoring, strengthening, blessing and consecrating a person, while its subtle scent is a lingering reminder of the spiritual graces that have been bestowed.

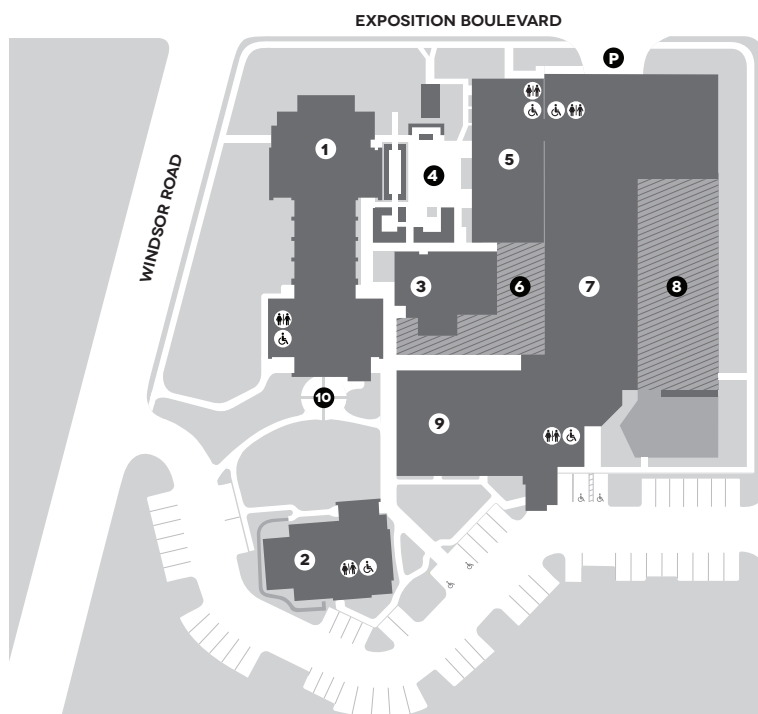
