



Liturgy Notes - Latin in the Liturgy

Over the past few weeks, we have seen how fragments of the original language of the Eucharist, Greek, have been retained in such things as the Kyrie eleison, the Phos Hilaron, the Trisagion, even the very word "Eucharist." Greek remains the liturgical language of much of the Eastern Church of course, but the breakup of the Empire in the late 4th century led to Latin becoming the lingua franca of the West. Consequently, much of the Book of Common Prayer comprises prayers and hymns translated from Latin texts.

Perhaps the best-known of those Latin hymns is the Gloria, known as the Great Doxology in the Eastern Church, where it originated as an Office hymn perhaps as early as the 2nd century. Translated into Latin by St Hilary of Poitiers in the 4th century, it was quickly absorbed into the Eucharistic liturgy of the West. Obviously, the kernel of the hymn is the song of the angels at Bethlehem, taken from Luke's Gospel, "Gloria in excelsis Deo," followed by an exuberant outpouring of praise for the Godhead. Consistent with ancient practice, the Gloria is not said or sung during Advent or Lent.

As well-known as the Gloria is another song attributed to angels, the Sanctus, described in Isaiah 6:3: 'Above (the Lord) were seraphim, each with six wings: with two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." 'The Book of Revelation describes a similar scene (4:8). Meanwhile, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" is, of course, the acclamation of the crowd on Palm Sunday: the two verses were stitched together and entered the liturgy of both the Eastern and Western Churches sometime in the 5th century. Because it is a hymn, it is another one of those texts that ideally should be sung whenever possible. However, like the Gloria, because it comprises verses of Sacred Scripture, is of great antiquity and is common to all major Christian traditions, it is not just a hymn but a liturgical text.

Another well-known Latin hymn, familiar to us all, is the Agnus Dei, or "Lamb of God," that ancient chant which originated in the East as part of the Gloria and made its way into the liturgy of the Western Church as a separate text around the sixth century. It has come down to us as a 'fraction anthem,' a chant that accompanies the breaking of the host and the pouring of the sacramental wine. In the early church, the Agnus Dei would continue to be sung by the congregation until all the bread for communion had been broken into small pieces for distribution and the chalices had been filled; we are simply continuing that ancient practice by breaking and pouring during this chant.

The text, of course, is from the first chapter of St John's Gospel, where St John the Baptist sees Jesus approaching and proclaims "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world". It is a mysterious greeting, because here, at the very beginning of Jesus' ministry, John anticipates the suffering and saving death his cousin will endure in the future. John perceives that in the same way that the blood of the sacrificed Passover lamb had once bought deliverance for God's people, while its flesh nourished and sustained them for their journey out of slavery and into freedom, so the flesh and blood of this innocent Lamb of God would buy salvation for all of God's children. Just as Christ's Body was once broken in suffering for our sake, we repeat John's acclamation while the sacrament is being divided, as a way of preparing ourselves for the reception of that Body and Blood in Holy Communion.


