Liturgy Notes – The Reserved Sacrament

It is a well-kept secret, but the Eucharist IS reserved at Good Shepherd. Behind the column to the right of the sanctuary, hidden from sight, is a safe containing the consecrated Bread and Wine, and on the wall next to it, a sanctuary lamp. The burning lamp is intended to signal that the Sacrament is present.

(Note: In the Episcopal church, the “sanctuary” is a very specific area around the altar, behind the altar rails. Non liturgical traditions often refer to the entire church building as ‘the sanctuary’ – that is not our custom. This and many other terms are explained in the Glossary at the Church’s website, episcopalchurch.org.)

Ideally, the Bread and Wine distributed at any celebration of the Eucharist should have been consecrated at that liturgy. When the first (1549) Book of Common Prayer specified “Thou shalt the minister take so much Bread and Wine, as shall suffice for the persons appointed to receive the holy Communion,” it was only reasserting the ancient practice of the church. The 1662 edition of the Prayer Book expected that all the Bread and Wine consecrated would be consumed at the same service.

So why do we reserve the Sacrament? There are at least three principal reasons, the most important being to take Holy Communion to the sick and dying. As early as the 2nd century, St. Justin Martyr described deacons communicating each of those present at the Sunday liturgy, and then carrying away the consecrated Bread and Wine to those who were absent. (*Just. M. Apol. I. cap. lxxv.*) This is the origin of our own Sunday custom of commissioning Eucharistic Ministers with these words: “In the name of this congregation, I send you forth bearing these holy gifts, that [name] may share with us in the communion of Christ’s body and blood,” to which the congregation replies with a verse from 1st Corinthians, “We who are many are one body, because we all share one bread, one cup.”

Another reason for reserving the Sacrament is for situations where a priest is not available. A Bishop may give permission for what in some places is inaccurately called a “Deacon’s Mass” – that is, a Liturgy of the Word followed by Holy Communion, usually officiated at by a deacon. This should always be the exception, not the rule.

Finally, in an observance that dates back to at least the 4th century, Holy Communion from the reserved Sacrament is offered at Good Friday’s Solemn Commemoration of the Passion. This marks, of course, the second of the three days of the Lord’s Passover, the Triduum. Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and the Great Vigil of Easter are regarded as the one liturgy, spread over three days, and Communion on this day can best be understood in that context.

We do not claim to know how Christ is present in the eucharistic elements, only that he IS present, and that the elements are not mere signs. One of our Church’s stated beliefs is “Christ’s body and blood become really present and are really given, so that believers may be united in communion with Christ the Lord.”* For many people, this sacramental presence enhances the church as a place of prayer, a source of comfort and reassurance.

At Good Shepherd, we try our best to distribute Holy Communion that has been consecrated at that service, but given the fluctuations in attendance, particularly throughout the pandemic, this is an inexact science. Sometimes we consecrate too much, sometimes too little. Managing the reserved Sacrament is a constant challenge to the Altar Guild and clergy, but whenever the elements are consecrated, the life of the crucified and risen Christ is given to his body, the church, so that its members may be more fully united with Christ and with one another.*

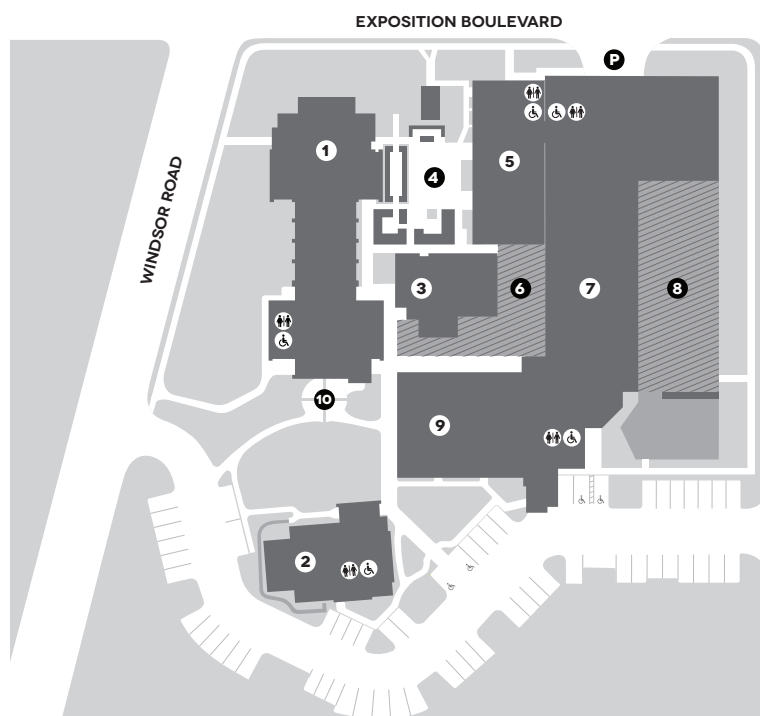
