

Liturgy Notes: Actions and Gestures, Part II

Bowing is one of the most ancient and yet still most common of ritual actions performed by both celebrant and congregation. The Book of Exodus equates bowing with recognizing the power and majesty of God, and the Psalms agree: "All the nations you have made shall come to bow before you, Lord, and give honor to your name." (Ps 86:9) We know that as early as the fourth century, the deacon called out to the congregation, "Bow your heads to receive God's blessing" (Apostolic Constitutions) and that in the sixth century the great Bishop of Arles, St Cesaire, instructed his flock, "Each time the deacon invites you with a loud voice to pray, bow faithfully not only your heart but also your body" (Sermon 77). Bowing clearly and wordlessly expresses reverence and respect toward a person or object.

There are two forms of bowing in the liturgy. A simple bow of the head is usually made at the mention of the divine names, particularly at the name of "Jesus". Some people bow towards the processional cross when it passes by, and towards the altar when they enter or leave the church, or move across the sanctuary. It is also common to bow at the mention of the word 'worship' during the Gloria, to simply emphasize the meaning of what is being said.

A profound bow, made with the torso from the waist up, is more normally made by the celebrant: toward the altar at the beginning and end of the liturgy, and toward the Sacrament at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer. Celebrant and congregation may also bow profoundly at the mention of the Incarnation in the Creed, "For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man", and during the doxology, when the three names of the Trinity are mentioned together in praise. Whereas the simple bow is a sign of respect, the profound bow is more expressive of adoration.

It probably does not need to be stressed that, for the congregation, these are personal actions, to be used by those who find them helpful for engaging their hearts and minds in the meaning of the liturgy. They are optional, by no means mandatory; they are intended to help, to be used as individuals wish.
