The Lessons

Today's Reading

The first lesson from Genesis attributes humanity's fall from grace, and loss of immortality to human disobedience to God's declared purposes.

The Epistle is a segment of a 4th letter Paul wrote to the Corinthian Christians, both Jews and Greeks. He reaffirms the resurrection hope for all.

In the Gospel, Jewish authorities take issue with Jesus, accusing him of being possessed by Beelzebul, a reference to ancient heresies that divided Israelites of the past. Jesus sternly counters the inference.

Short Introductions to the Bible Readings for the Revised Common Lectionary.

FIRST READING A Reading from the Book of Genesis

3:8-15

Lector They heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. But the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, "Where are you?" He said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself." He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate." Then the Lord God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent tricked me, and I ate." The Lord God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, cursed are you among all animals and among all wild creatures; upon your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel."



Mark 3:20-35

Gospeller The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Gospeller The crowd came together again, so that Jesus and his disciples could not even eat. When his family heard it, they went out to restrain him, for people were saying, "He has gone out of his mind." And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem said, "He has Beelzebul, and by the ruler of the demons he casts out demons." And he called them to him, and spoke to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but his end has come. But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his property without first tying up the strong man; then indeed the house can be plundered.


