

About today's service

In the New Testament, the word "saints" is used to describe the entire membership of the Christian community. From very early times, however, the word "saint" came to be applied primarily to those individuals whose lives of Christian witness had been formally recognized by the church. Beginning in the tenth century, it became customary to set aside another day on which the church remembered the wider fellowship of the deceased who are no less saints. It was also a day for particular remembrance of family members and friends. At Good Shepherd, we commemorate the Feast of All Souls today with a liturgy that incorporates elements of a traditional burial rite and a reading of the necrology, a list of those beloved by the community who have died.

About the music

The Requiem Mass setting you will hear today was written by American Composer Morten Lauridsen. It is adapted from his Lux Aeterna, which was premiered in concert by the Los Angeles Master Chorale in April of 1997. In this work, Lauridsen makes use of a number of pre-existing themes, ranging from Gregorian Chant fragments to Lutheran Chorale melodies. Many of his compositional procedures here stem from those of the Middle Ages and Renaissance, but with a tonal palette which is fresh, contemporary and highly accessible to the casual listener.

Today's Readings

Deuteronomy 6:1-9 Deuteronomy is a later reflection in Jewish literature on the meaning of the Exodus and the call to love God exclusively.

Hebrews 9:11-14 The writer continues the theme of Christ as High Priest. Christ offers himself as the sacrificial victim in the inner sanctum of the temple, or tent of meeting.

Mark 12:28-34 Jesus declares the essence of the Law is summed up in two quotations—one from Deuteronomy and the other from Leviticus.

The Lessons

READING I A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

Lector Moses said: Now this is the commandment--the statutes and the ordinances--that the LORD your God charged me to teach you to observe in the land that you are about to cross into and occupy, so that you and your children and your children's children, may fear the LORD your God all the days of your life, and keep all his decrees and his commandments that I am commanding you, so that your days may be long. Hear therefore, O Israel, and observe them diligently, so that it may go well with you, and so that you may multiply greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, as the LORD, the God of your ancestors, has promised you.

Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

For if the blood of goats and bulls, with the sprinkling of the ashes of a heifer, sanctifies those who have been defiled so that their flesh is purified, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, purify our conscience from dead works to worship the living God!
