The Holy Eucharist – readings from and responses to the Bible and the celebration of Holy Communion – is the central act of Sunday worship in the Episcopal Church. The page numbers to the right of some headings, while not necessary to participate in the service, refer to *The Book of Common Prayer* (red book) found in the pew racks.

#### THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Celebrant: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons,

loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people,

and respect the dignity of every human being?

*People:* I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live

in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and

reigns now and for ever.

People: Amen.

### THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Celebrant: In the waters of baptism, we are named as children of God and sisters and brothers to one another. Let us therefore pray for ourselves, for one another, and for all those in need of our prayers.

Leader: Let us pray for an end to the pandemic, that we may once again travel, work, worship

weak be made strong, and all who suffer be relieved. Lord, in your mercy,

People: Hear our prayer.

Leader: Let us pray for those who have gone before us, especially those whom we now name

before you .....May we be reunited with them in the joy of everlasting life. Lord, in your mercy,

People: Hear our prayer.

Leader: For those who have died (especially those we name before you now.......) That they

may know peace with you forever. Lord, in your mercy,

People: Hear our prayer.

Celebrant: Holy and immortal One, you know our thoughts and needs better than we ourselves.

Accept the prayers which we now offer, and strengthen us to do your will, through

Iesus Christ our Lord.
