THE READINGS

READING I *A reading from the first book of Samuel*

3; I-10

Lector Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the LORD under Eli. The word of the LORD was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the LORD, where the ark of God was. Then the LORD called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. The LORD called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." Now Samuel did not yet know the LORD, and the word of the LORD had not yet been revealed to him. The LORD called Samuel again, a third time. Liturgy Notes: The Scottish Liturgies

As our very name suggests, The Episcopal Church has a long and close connection to the Scottish Episcopal Church. When, in the late 17th century, the Scottish bishops refused to swear allegiance to William and Mary, reasoning that the deposed Stuart James II was still their legitimate monarch, the entire Scottish church was disestablished and replaced by the Presbyterian Church. Their independence from the Crown allowed Samuel Seabury, the first American bishop of the Episcopal Church, to be consecrated at Aberdeen in 1784 without taking an oath of allegiance.

In the meantime, deprived of much of their property and benefices, and greatly reduced in numbers, the Scottish church struggled to survive. Unable to afford printing their own Book of Common Prayer, they resorted to producing ‘wee bookies,’ pamphlets containing the essential liturgies. These pamphlets may have been cheap, but they facilitated a flowering of scholarship and research into Eucharistic origins. This liturgical flexibility and agility endures in the Scottish Church: an experimental liturgy appeared around the same time as our current Prayer Book, but has since been followed up by additional Eucharistic prayers, new Baptismal, Marriage and Funeral Rites and most recently materials for the care of Creation. Without the pressure and expense of producing an entire Prayer Book, the Scots seem to have focused on the beauty of language and advances in learning, as well as responding to evolving contemporary concerns.

It was for these reasons, as well as our historic relationship, that led us to using one of the newer Scottish Eucharistic Prayers over the Christmas season. The Preface connects the Holy Spirit hovering over the waters at the very dawn of creation with the Spirit overshadowing the Virgin Mary at the Annunciation, the same Spirit who will complete all of Creation. The Prayer goes on to speak of the principal scenes of the infancy narratives: the manger at Bethlehem, the flight into Egypt, the carpenter’s son. Finally, at the end, St Joseph – one of the great heroes of the story and yet so often unmentioned and overlooked – is remembered along with the Virgin Mary. This Christmas Eucharistic Prayer is just one of seven prayers offered in the latest (2022) revision, which also includes prayers for Advent, Epiphany, Lent and Eastertide.

General Convention, here in Austin, permitted us to use authorized liturgical resources from around the Anglican Communion, and so we are able to draw on the full riches of our tradition to deepen and enhance our prayer.

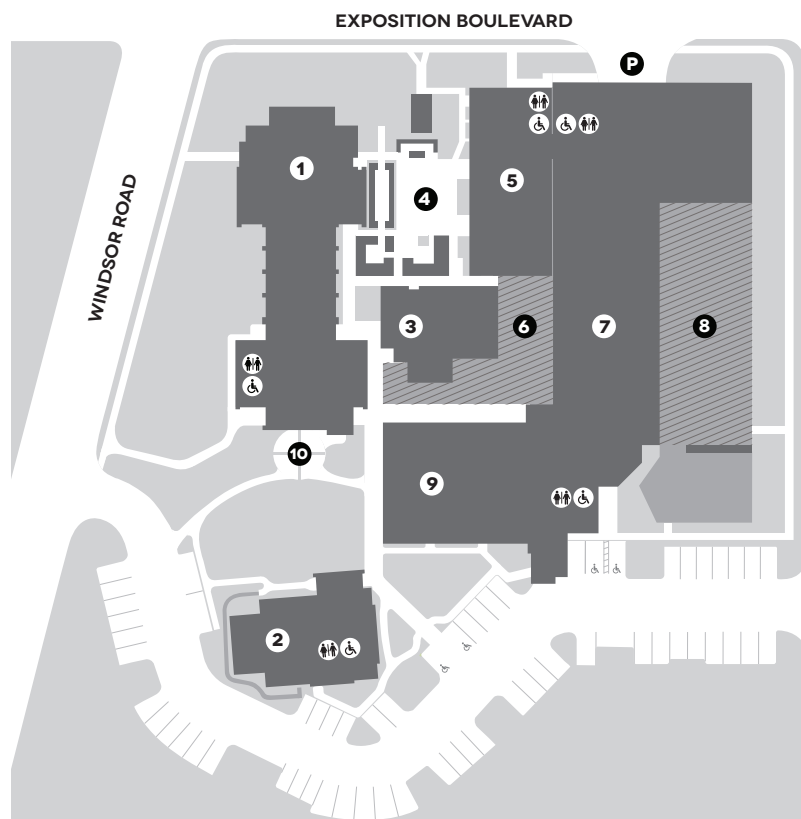
