Liturgy Notes: The Psalm

Thumb through the Psalm section of the Prayer Book—the Psalter—and you’ll find a number of notations and directions that may not make a lot of sense. For example, *First Day: Morning Prayer* appears on the first page: keep turning and you will discover that the entire book of psalms has been divided into morning and evening prayer for thirty days. This is for those who wish to pray every psalm over the course of a month. Immediately after the psalm number there is a short Latin phrase: this is simply the first words of the psalm. For example, Psalm 100, *Jubilate Deo*, begins “Be joyful in the Lord”. These Latin phrases are simply ways of recognizing and remembering the text. Elsewhere there are Hebrew notations: Psalm 119 is divided into parts, each of them assigned a letter from the Hebrew alphabet (or ‘alephbet’!).

The Psalms are not meant to be read as prose – they are liturgical poems with distinct structures and patterns. They do not have meter or rhyme, but verses are usually couplets or triplets, and routinely employ parallelisms: “Purge me from my sin, and I shall be pure; * wash me, and I shall be clean indeed.” (ps. 51). The asterisk at the end of the first line of each verse indicates that a distinct pause should be made (see: Prayer Book p. 583).

The Prayer Book suggests different ways of reciting the psalms: singing or saying them, directly, antiphonally or responsorially. At Morning Prayer, we *recite* the assigned psalm *directly* – that is, we read it in unison, just as it is written. *Antiphonal* recitation comprises two groups singing or saying alternate verses; one person alternating with a group is *responsive* recitation. In our church we employ all these methods – on weekdays we recite responsively, while on Sundays we often sing the psalm *directly*, and sometimes *responsorially*, where the verses are sung by the cantor and the congregation sings a refrain after each verse or group of verses. This was once the traditional method of chanting the psalms between the Lessons at the Eucharist.

Although many of the psalms are attributed to King David, they were not written down until about 500 years after David’s death. This does not disprove David’s authorship, but suggests they were remembered and passed down as poems or hymns. Many texts state that a particular psalm is ‘a song’, or ‘an ode’, or ‘a hymn’, and include precise instructions concerning the manner in which it is to be sung. The New Testament and early Christian documents establish that the custom of singing psalms has been a part of Christian worship from the very beginning. Gregorian chant was developed by monastic communities as a method of singing the psalms; the Orthodox church has their own set of chant modes or tones. Anglican chant represented the English cathedrals’ approach to the same desire, so that across the Church, from East to West, the psalter, said or sung, still comprises a major part of the prayer of the Church.
