Priest <*N.*>, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

¶ The Priest then marks the newly baptized's forehead with chrism oil, making the sign of the cross.

Priest <*N.*>, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

¶ After the Baptism the Priest gives to the newly baptized a candle lighted from the Paschal Candle.


