### WORSHIP

The Holy Eucharist – readings from and responses to the Bible and the celebration of Holy Communion – is the central act of Sunday worship in the Episcopal Church. This leaflet contains the text and hymns necessary to participate in this service.

## THE COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

- ¶ *Communion in the Episcopal Church: We welcome all baptized Christians, including children of all ages, to receive Holy Communion. If you prefer to receive a blessing, please come forward and cross your arms over your chest. You are also welcome to remain in your seat. If you would like to learn more about baptism, please contact a member of the clergy.*
- ¶ *How to Receive Communion: Communion will be administered at four stations—in front of the lectern, in front of the pulpit, at the back pew, and in Allen Hall. Ushers will direct you to a station based on where you are seated. You will receive the bread first, and then you may either dip the bread in the wine or take a sip directly from the chalice. You may also decline the chalice as Communion in one kind (bread only) is full Communion. Gluten-free wafers are available at all stations; please let the Minister know if you need one.*
